Social and environmental issues, pertaining to larger domain of geosciences are also be within the scope of its endeavours towards information dissemination.

Submission of Manuscripts

Manuscripts of snippets, short research communications and articles, notes and commentaries are invited for the next issue of the Journal. Send your manuscript prepared in MS Word 2010 in double space along with three hard copies and text in compact disc (CD) at least three months in advance of the publication months (June & December) using special characters, as embedded in the thematic volumes already brought out by the IGC.

Short Communications & Discussions

Short notes & discussions not more than 3000-4000 words on papers and technical reports will be welcome for publication in the bulletin. The editor may, however, waive these limits to encourage high relevance of the contribution to topical research areas and also for such topics that may not be treated within these limits. Topics may include state-of-the-art reviews and detail case histories. Stipulations concerning submission of contributions are subject to revision in due course as per suggestions of the members of the Editorial Board.

Notes to Contributors

The following suggestions, for the present, should suffice for those who may wish to send contributions for the next issue.

- ♦ Manuscripts (MS) should be written in English.
- ♦ MS preferably be prepared on a word processor and printed in at least 12 font size in double space, leaving wide margin (not less than 2.5 cm) on each side and include an abstract of not more than 300 words.
- ♦ Contributors should use well-known and widely practiced terminology, preferably IUGS terminology.
- ♦ The title page should include the name (s) of the author (s), their affiliations, fax & e-mail numbers, etc. In case of more than one author, please indicate whom the correspondence should be made.
- Authors should provide 4 to 5 keywords.
- References in the text should have the surname of the author (s) followed by the year of publication. All references cited in the paper should be given in the reference list and vice versa.
- All references should be written in alphabetical order.
- ♦ Illustrations & photographs (glossy paper) of excellent quality should be consecutively numbered & referred to in the text.
- One set of galley proof will be sent to the corresponding author to be checked for typesetting / editing oversights.
- ♦ The authors will have to pay reasonable cost for 25 reprints (Rs. 600) and also for the coloured illustrations (Rs. 600) per page of the Journal's format. Amount of the coloured figures will be informed by the IGC office before the paper is sent to the press.

The author of the contribution will be solely responsible for the statement, comments, or views expressed therein, and the publication will not imply that the given statements and / or opinions are, or reflect the views, of the Editorial Board, or the IGC Executive Council.

> Language: English; > Font: Times New Roman; > Title: 18 point font (Caps-small and bold); > Author' name: 13 point font (Caps-small and bold); > Affiliations and e-mails: 13 point font (Caps-small); > Abstract: 9 point font; > Main Heading: 11 point font, all cap. and bold; > 1st Sub-heading: 11 point font, caps-small and bold; > 2nd Sub-heading: 11 point font, small and bold; > 3rd Sub-heading: 11 point font, small bold and italics; > Acknowledgement: 11 point font; > References: 11 point font, surname first & alphabetical. Example: Pachauri, A. K., 2016. Disaster Management of Landslides in the Indian Himalaya. Jour. Ind. Geol. Cong., Vol.8(1), pp.27-48. > Figures/ Photographs's caption: 9 point font; > Table: Caption at the top.
